JACKSON COMMUNITY CONCRETE FARMER'S MARKETS

Pastor Tonya Ware, executive director of The Church Triumphant Global's Health Innovative Strategies Program, was driving around Jackson a year ago looking at overgrown vacant lots and had an idea: Turn these lots into pop-up farmer's markets for a day and directly link communities with local farmers and healthy foods to build healthy lives.

She and her team, in partnership with the MS Department of Health - Office of Preventive Health, Community Foundation for MS, Foot Print Farms, West Jackson Rotary, and Community Strong 4 Jackson, are tearing down barriers that have hindered families from accessing healthy foods.
